Founder's Message

Not only did we outfit the basketball team at Pioneer, but we were able to spread the abundance, sending boxes of Nike garments to two other mental health agencies.

We had a comical experience prior to our Perfection Party in NYC this past June. Janine: It is complicated and a combination of a lot of factorsbiology, genetics, environment, societal issues.

Miles: Does Flawless do research or help with daily lifestyle, improving lives?

Janine: We do both. We are involved with a doctor at Harvard who has come up with a really cool way to solve problems while collaborating with kids. We help promote his work and research. Flawless also supports "lifestyle" programs such as yoga, music and art, gardening to help kids feel better and be healthier.

Miles: A few more questions (I feel like the business manager right now)- Is this stuff happening now or are we getting money to do things in the future?



Chat with Dr. Stuart Ablon

Director of Think: Kids. Mass. General and Associate Clinical Professor of **Psychiatry at Harvard Medical School**

One of our most exciting projects is our collaboration with Dr. Ablon of Think:Kids (www.thinkkids.org). We sponsored a conference with Dr. Ablon at Oregon Health Science University in August and had 100 physicians and mental health professionals in attendance. We are currently funding the production of a training video from that conference which will educate people all over the world about this revolutionary approach. Our video interview of Dr. Ablon was just posted on YouTube and has been viewed by over 1300 people. Below is an excerpt from this informational interview.



Dr. Ablon: Well, in a nutshell, it's actually a completely different mentality for thinking about who challenging kids are, and when I say challenging kids what I mean is, kids who can be very aggressive or explosive, but also kids who can be implosive as well. We're talking about a really wide range of kids who have trouble tolerating frustration. problem solving, and being flexible. And they respond in all kinds of ways to these challenges that we adults are not so wild about. And the reality is that CPS brings a completely different view of who these kids are and what they need to the table. So it's a

dramatic change in terms of what we make of it and as a result, what to do about it.

Janine: What's the philosophy behind Collaborative Problem Solving?

Dr. Ablon: This is an approach that has a philosophy behind it, which is the anchor when the going gets tough. And the philosophy is very simple. It's "Kids do well if they can", which is just to say that if a kid could do well, he would do well. If he's not doing well, something has got to be standing in his way, and it's up to us to figure out what is getting in his way and how we can help.
